1,178 people received
45,943 home delivered meals.



4,465 clients statewide

185 people were new

656 inquiries were addressed

distributed to Meals on
Wheels clients.



34 Education Center classes
and Healthy Living for ME
workshops were presented
online, engaging 149 people.



44 volunteers assisted with
Meals on Wheels, 27 of which
were new volunteers.



180 clients received
Medicare enrollment advice.



3 volunteers helped with
friendly check-in calls
to clients.



939 clients received Atypical
Services support (emergency
response systems, respite,
environmental modification,
or assistive technology).



79 caregivers received
support.
